UIPM 2022 PENTATHLON WORLD CUP BUDAPEST: ALL YOU NEED TO KNOW



- World champion Marosi (HUN) aiming for glory on home soil
- Micheli (ITA) and Gulyas (HUN) ready to battle for gold again
- Semi-finals to be streamed live on UIPM TV for the first time

One of the greatest pentathletes of all time, **Adam Marosi** of Hungary, resumes his career in a star-studded field at UIPM 2022 Pentathlon World Cup Budapest.

Now 37, Marosi (HUN) finished 6th at the rescheduled Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games last year and now aims for glory on home soil as part of a formidable national team including world No.1 **Michelle Gulyas** (HUN).


The competition will be the second to feature the new, TV-friendly format designed for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games. All five disciplines are contested in a 90-minute blitz of action and a new champion is crowned inside two hours.

The action began today (April 26) and two days of qualification will determine the line-up for the new-look Semi-finals on April 28/29. Only 36 athletes (18 female, 18 male) will return for the Finals

on April 30 before the competition concludes with the Mixed Relay on May 1.

Budapest (HUN) will also be the venue for two days of important meetings relating to the New 5th Discipline process designed to transform Modern Pentathlon for the Los Angeles 2028 Olympic Games. The New 5th Discipline Working Group will meet on May 1 to discuss proposals to be presented to the UIPM Executive Board on May 2.

Ones to watch

She soared to the top of the world rankings in a breakthrough 2021 season that makes Gulyas (HUN) an obvious favourite for gold in front of a home support in the Hungarian capital.

However, she will have to improve on her performance in Cairo (EGY) last month where she was narrowly beaten by world No.8 **Elena Micheli** of **Italy**, who will be back on the start line in Budapest (HUN).

A new generation of athletes has been enticed by the new format and the chance to start afresh with a new Olympic cycle, but the women's field also contains some established podium contenders such as **Marie Oteiza** of **France** and Rio 2016 Olympic bronze medallist **Oktawia Nowacka** of **Poland**.


African champion **Haydy Morsy** of **Egypt** and Pan American champion **Mariana Arceo** of **Mexico** are also likely to be prominent.

On the men's side, the host nation can have even higher expectations of success after naming a star-studded team that includes former Pentathlon World Cup winners **Robert Kasza** (HUN) and **Bence Demeter** (HUN) alongside the veteran Marosi (HUN).

However, the entry list screams of quality and all of the Olympians who finished 5th to 8th in Tokyo

(JPN) – **Martin Vlach** of Czech Republic, Marosi (HUN), **Valentin Prades** (FRA) and **Jan Kuf** (CZE) respectively – will be on the start line looking to add to their career medal hauls.
