UIPM 2024 PENTATHLON JUNIOR WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS: ALL YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Egypt senior stars Ismail and Mohamed lead host nation challenge
- Unterberger (GER) leads returning women's medallists from 2023
- New format with Obstacle in place for second time at Under 22 level

Host nation **Egypt** fields a team crammed with talent in the face of a global challenge in this week's UIPM 2024 Pentathlon Junior World Championships.

The North African powerhouse has enjoyed considerable success at senior and youth categories in recent years and, having won Women's Team gold 12 months ago, will be eager to add more junior crowns to a packed trophy cabinet.

Highly-ranked seniors **Malak Ismail** (11) and **Moutaz Mohamed** (5) lead the home challenge. Both won two medals on the UIPM 2024 Pentathlon World Cup circuit and Ismail (EGY) is

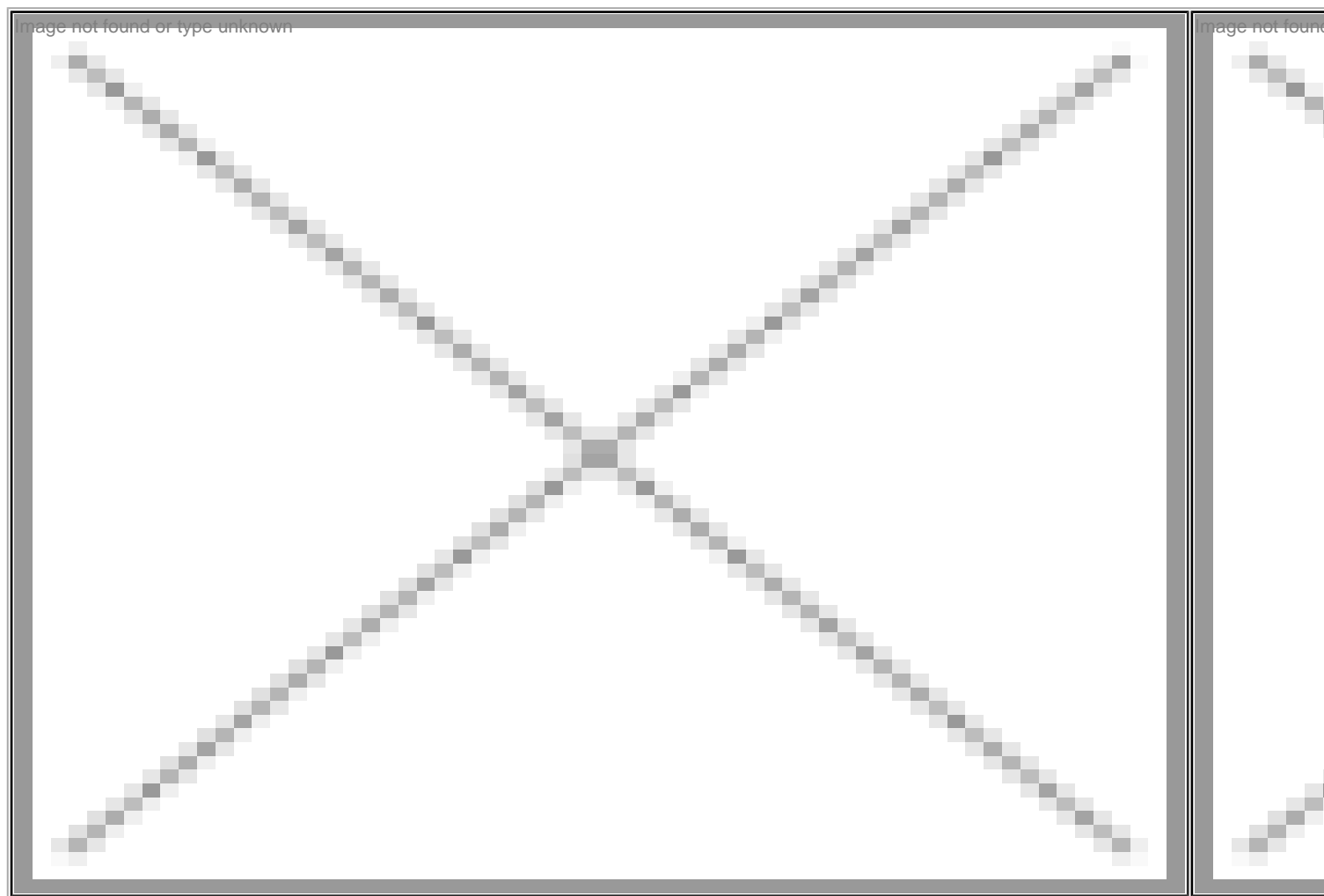
expected to be named in the Egypt team for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games.

The 18-year-old Asian senior champion, **Sumin Shin** of **Korea**, is another enticing prospect to watch, while all the individual medallists from the 2023 Women's Final – **Josefine Unterberger** of **Germany**, **Katarzyna Debska** of **Poland** and **Louison Cazaly** of **France** – return to resume their rivalry. Also on the start line are the twins who became world junior champions in last year's Mixed Relay, **Florina** and **Katharina Jurt** of **Switzerland**.

Having undergone their first full year of training for Obstacle, it will be intriguing to see which of these promising young athletes have made the most progress in mastering the discipline.

On the men's side, like Ismail (EGY), **Etienne Clergeau** (FRA) is the reigning world Under 19 champion. He will aim to demonstrate his readiness for this new challenge at U22 level, but there will be intense competition from a global spread of nations, with **Canada**, **China**, **Great Britain**, **Hungary**, **Italy**, **South Africa**, **Türkiye** and **Ukraine** among those sending large delegations of athletes.

Six days of action at the Arab Academy for Science Technology & Maritime Transport in Alexandria (EGY) kicked off today with the Women's and Men's Relays. The competition reaches a climax with the Women's and Men's Finals on Saturday 29 June.

UIPM President Dr Klaus Schormann said: "The UIPM 2024 Pentathlon Junior World Championships promises to be a thrilling and captivating week of competition – with historic importance too. This is the second time our junior athletes will compete to become world

champions in the new Modern Pentathlon format of Obstacle, Fencing, Swimming and Laser Run.

“Some of these Under 22 athletes are also preparing for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games, taking place six weeks from now, demonstrating remarkable versatility as they train for not five but six Modern Pentathlon disciplines!

“We depended on Alexandria to host several showpiece competitions during the pandemic, and now we return in happier times to this wonderful place where education and sport are so beautifully intertwined. The world continues to be shaken by regional conflicts, but we can use sport as a beacon of peace and respect.

“I would like to thank the Egyptian Modern Pentathlon Federation for arranging this competition with the support of the Egypt Government, the Egyptian Olympic Committee and our hosts, the Arab Academy for Science Technology & Maritime Transport of Alexandria, as well as all volunteers, sponsors and media representatives.”
